“Welcome Home – a story about a Queer Elderly Community in Berlin” and “26 de Diciembre” are two chapters of a bigger project which looks at alternative ways of living and caring practices for older LGBT people in contemporary Europe.

Welcome Home (2014) collects life stories of the people who live and work at the Lebensort Vielfalt, their definitions of community, care and support. The Lebensort Vielfalt is the first LGBT inter-generational elderly community in Berlin, managed and organized by the community itself.

In *26 de Diciembre* (2016), Brenda, Sarai, Federico, Yakob and Maria disclose, through their stories, experiences and utopias, issues of community-building, care relationships, activism, recognition and celebration for older LGBT people in Spain. They are, among others, people who live, work, volunteer or socialize in the spaces of *La Fundacion 26 de Diciembre* in Madrid.
